What to Pack List

Clothing guidelines for the workshop:

- 1. Work Clothes—old clothing, bring enough to change into when they get wet. You will be washing animals twice and clipping
- 2. Shoes—sturdy shoes to protect feet-steel toes are the best! No flip flops or open toed shoes while working with animals. You may bring other shoes to wear to bathroom or meals
- 3. Wash clothes- rain gear/ waterproof jackets/pants or ponchos/ etc that you will be washing your animal in the am
- 4. Show clothes—white shirt (preferably collared), long white pants (no capris, pedal pushers etc.) or a skirt. Belt. Show harness (recommended). Sturdy shoes/work boots. **Show will be judged according to these official dress standards.

Lunch, snacks and drinks will be provided. Dinner is on your own at the fair.

Supplies /materials to bring along with your animal:

- 1. Registration/Ownership papers and current health papers, self-certification health paper, interstate papers if applicable
- 2. Calf grain, hay and beet pulp
- 3. Feed pan
- 4. Water bucket
- 5. Hose with good nozzle
- 6. Washing supplies
- 7. Clippers, Kool-lube etc.
- 8. Show supplies to get animal ready for showmanship (Show halter, soft brush, show shine, etc.)
- 9. Pitchfork/shovel
- 10. Extension cords
- 11. Rake

This year we are focusing on clipping and fitting. Please bring your heifer ready to clip with her head and legs clipped.

Staff will have wheelbarrows for your use. Please empty before spilling over and leave space for others.
